Arbitration and Mediation Laws

- It plays a major important role in protecting the rights of labour, their union, their wages, and moreover building a link between government and workers.
- It is a protective code for laborers, workers, and employees as well, to make them aware of their rights & also, to establish a standard law regarding labour work practice.



Eligibility For Award of Law Degree

- 1) A student of B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. program passing examination of all the years or classes, divided in ten and six semesters, shall be eligible to obtain the B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. degree.
- 2) A student of LL.B program passing examination of all years or classes divided in six semesters shall be eligible to obtain the LL.B. Degree.
- 3) A student of B.A., LL.B. and B.B.A. LL.B. program, to become eligible for award of the degree, must pass in all the subjects, divided in Ten Semesters, within a span of **Seven** Academic years and that LL.B. in 3 years.
- 4) A student completing B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. & LL.B. program shall be offered a Grade on 10 Point Grading Systems Corresponding to the marks obtained in the course.

Eligibility For Award of Degree

(1) A student passing examination of third year of B.A.LL.B. & B.B.A. LL.B. shall be eligible to obtain the first degree of B.A. under the Integrated B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. Course provided that he/she has passed examination of second year of B.A.LL.B., course provided that he/she has passed examination of second year of B.A.LL.B. Such a degree of B.A. shall not entitle the student to enroll as an advocate.

(2) A student of B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. Course passing examination of all the year or classes, divided in ten semesters, shall be eligible to obtain the B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. Degree.



Duration to Complete Entire Course

A student of B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. Course, in order to become eligible for award of the degree, must pass in all the subjects, divided in ten semesters, within a span period of Seven academic years including academic year in which he/she was admitted to first year of the course. No student shall be admitted as a candidate for any examination of the said course after the said period of Seven academic years unless he/she is readmitted to the course as a fresh candidate and in case of LL.B. is 5 years.

Rules of Attendance & Practical Training

CLASS ATTENDANCE

Students shall attend at least 80% of lectures delivered in each subject/semester. Students with less than 75% attendance are not eligible to write examinations at the end of the semester.



Tutorials For B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. & LL.B. Course

Students shall write and attend the prescribed number of tutorials for each year to the satisfaction of the faculty.



Journal Work / Internship Dairy & Viva-voce Examination For B.A.LL.B., B.B.A. LL.B. & LL.B.

Under the scheme of Practical Training Programme, each student shall compulsorily maintain a Journal / Internship Dairy as may be prescribed by the institution for the clinical work done by him and from time to time regularly record in it the work allotted to and done by him in his own handwriting and the dates thereto under his signature and the same be scrutinized and counter signed from time to time by concerned Professor-in-charge.

The journal shall be submitted to the institution for assessment. The Professor-in-charge or some other examiner or a panel of examiners from time to time or at the end of the term as per the discretion of the Principal of the College, shall assess the journal.

As per the syllabus prescribed for practical training paper, a Viva-Voce Examination shall be held on behalf of the University by a committee of two examiners (one external and one internal) to be appointed by the University who will ask questions to the students on the basis of the clinical work done by them and marks will be allotted to them accordingly.

Court Visits / Attendance at Other Places

Students under the supervision of a Professor-in-charge shall visit at least three of the following places during such working day and timing as may be decided by the institution. The object of this course is to enable the students to understand the actual working in some of the departments and the documents maintained by them with a view to familiarise them.

The Visits will be to any of the following places –

1. Office of the Registrars, Clerks of Courts
2. Nazirs, Record Keepers, etc in courts
3. Police Station
4. Office of the Sub-registrar under the Indian Registration Act

Attendance in Courts

Each student shall be required to attend at least two cases or proceedings or interim petitions of courts, as far as possible from start to finish, arising out of the following:

1. Civil Court
2. Criminal Court
3. Small cause court proceedings or
4. Proceedings before a Co-operative court or a Labour court, or a Revenue court or any other court as may be decided by the Professor-in-charge
5. Field visit to local areas and villages for Free Legal Aid Activities / Legal Literacy Program Students shall be required to make their own notes and observations about the proceedings of the Court so visited and attended by them including the facts of the proceedings, legal issues involved and record them in the journal/ Internship Diary maintained by them. The journal so maintained for this purpose shall be assessed for the purpose of allotting marks under practical training paper.



Attendance at Lawyer's Chamber

Students under practical training paper shall attend the offices of advocates on such days and during such timings as the concerned Advocates may suggest. The object of this course is to enable a student to make himself conversant with the working in an Advocates office as to how he takes instructions from clients and so on. The observation made by the student shall be recorded in the journal under practical training paper and the same shall be assessed for allotment of marks.

An applicant who has successfully completed Senior Secondary School Course (10+2) or equivalent (such as 11+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving certificate course) from a recognised University of India or outside or from a Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognised by the Union or by State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognised by the Government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the programme of the Centres of Legal Education to obtain the integrated degree in law with a degree in any other subject as the first degree from the University whose such a degree in law is recognised by the Bar Council of India for the purpose of enrolment.

An applicant who has successfully completed Pre-University course or Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent such as (10+1), 'A' level in Senior School Leaving Certificate Course) from a recognized University/ Institutions of India or outside or from Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Central or State Government/s of India or from any equivalent institutions form a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of International qualifying certificate equivalent to 10+2 on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the course.



Explanations

Provided those applicants who have obtained 12 Std. / Higher Secondary Pass Certificate / First Degree certificate or equivalent course through distance or correspondence method, only after passing the basic qualifications (i.e. Secondary Schooling / 10th Std. in Regular mode) for prosecuting such correspondence / distance 12th Std. / Higher Secondary schooling courses, shall also be considered as eligible for admission to the 5 years LL. B. courses.

An applicant who has passed the 11th / 12th / Pre Degree Course examination from State / Central Boards of Schooling or from Open Schooling System recognized & established by the Government of the State / India or International Board of School Education, after prosecuting the basic course of studies in the pattern of 1st to 10th standards in Regular mode, at Secondary Schooling is eligible for admission to five-year Integrated LL. B. Course.

The applicant who has passed the prescribed basic qualification i.e. 10th Std. / Secondary Schooling Certificate Examination, in a single sitting examination, without having basic qualification (i.e. 1 to 9th std. of schooling) is not eligible for admission to five year Integrated LL.B. Law Courses.

Admission Process



Prohibition To Register For Two Regular Courses

No student shall be allowed to simultaneously register for a Law degree programme with any other graduate or post graduate or certificate course run by the same or any other university or an institution for academic or professional learning excepting in the integrated degree programme of the same institution. Provided that any short period part time certificate course on language, computer science or computer application of an institute or any run by a centre for Distance Learning of a University however, shall be exempted.

Minimum Marks in Qualifying Examination For Admission

Bar Council of India may from time to time, stipulate the minimum percentage of marks not below 45% of the total marks in case of general category applicants 42% for OBC and 40% of the total marks in case of SC and ST applicants, to be obtained for the qualifying examination, such as +2 examination in case of integrated five year course for the purpose of applying for and getting admitted into a Law degree programme of any recognised University in either of the streams. Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an institution but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfil other institutional criteria notified by the institution concerned or by the Government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

Prohibition Against Lateral Entry & Exit

There shall be no lateral entry on the plea of Graduation in any subject or exit by way of awarding degree splitting the integrated double degree course, at any intermediary stage of integrated double degree course." However, a University may permit any person to audit any subject or number of subjects by attending classes regularly and taking the tests for obtaining a Certificate of Participation from the University/Faculty according to the rules prescribed by the University from time to time and give a Certificate therefore.

LL.M. Course

1) Eligibility :

Every Candidate seeking admission to the Master of Laws (LL.M.) Programme must have passed the LL. B. Degree after completing three or all the five years LL.B. Course of this University or its equivalent degree of another statutory University recognized as equivalent to said degree of this University.

2) Admission :

- 6.1 The affiliated colleges for admission purposes will follow the selection procedure / policies adopted by the respective Law College. Reservation and relaxation will be as per the rules prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra and Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune from time to time.
- 6.2 The number of students admitted to each LL.M. specialization will be decided by the Principal of the affiliated college, in consultation with the PG Department Internal Committee of the affiliated college.
7. Constitution and P.G. Department Internal Committee of affiliated Law College The PG Departmental Internal Committee of affiliated law college –
 - 1) Consisting of Consisting of all the teachers teaching to the LL.M. Programme in the Affiliated Law college,
 - 2) This committee will approve the plan for the internal evaluation of LL. M. Course.
 - 3) This committee will decide the norms other criterion for student from other PG colleges opting for the courses at PG Department of affiliated Law College.

3) Instructions for the Students:

The students seeking admission to LL. M. Programme are hereby informed that they are supposed to adhere to the following rules:

- 8.1 A minimum of 75 % attendance for grant of term.
- 8.2 The students are supposed to attend all the Internal Assessment Activities, Workshops / Seminars /Training Programmes / Symposia / Study Tour organized by the P. G. Department of the affiliated Law College.

4) General Objectives of LL.M. Course :

- 1) To make the students aware of the conceptual basis, nature of the law and its formulation.
- 2) To familiarize them with the basic principles underlying each course of study.
- 3) To acquaint them with the evolutionary processes of each law in the context of social, political, economic and other factors.
- 4) To expose to the students about the subject matter in detail with the help of legislative, judicial and other materials.
- 5) To introduce them to research methodology and its practical applications.
- 6) To familiarize the students with the use of the library and to develop the capacity to search and collect reading and reference materials on a given topic.
- 7) To train the students in skills for collection of empirical data and applying the law to practical situation to study role of law in social change (practical ramification).
- 8) To develop the capacity for coherent and reasoned expression.
- 9) To encourage students to enhance their capacity to:
 - a) Interpret and evaluate law, legal processes and legal institutions.
 - b) Analyze fact situations and suggest probable legal solutions.
 - c) Evaluate societal needs and suggest viable solutions through modification in the existing laws, processes and institutions.
- 10) To train them in the writing of research papers/dissertations.

5) Expectations of Students' Attainment:

The students are expected to exhibit the general objective of the LL. M. Programme by –

- 1) Understanding of the basic principles in each course.
- 2) Acquaintance with up-to-date statutory, judicial and other materials.
- 3) Appreciation of leading juristic writing.
- 4) Coherent and reasoned expression.
- 5) Solution of given problems in the context of laws and principles.



- 6) Anticipation of legal solutions to evolve societal needs.
- 7) Capacity for critical appreciation of the materials studied, and ability for independent thinking.
- 8) Familiarity with the elementary rules of research methodology and practice in legal research and writing.
- 9) Understand practical implications and ramification of theoretical law with interdisciplinary approach.

7) Course Duration

12.1 The duration of LL. M. Programme is two years. Each academic year is divided into 2 semesters (Odd and Even). The semester pattern is designed with continuous assessment system.

12.2 A student shall be granted the term for the course concerned if he/she has put in an attendance not less than 75% of the lectures and practicals (internal activities).

8) LL.M. Programme Structure

13.1 The Two-year LL.M. Programme shall consist of 70 credits spread over two years and the same shall be divided into four semesters.

13.2 The First year will be divided into 2 semesters which will carry 38 credits in toto (Semester I is 18 Credits and Semester - II is 20 Credits).

13.3 The Second Year will also be divided into 2 semesters and will carry 32 credits in toto (Semester -III is 16 Credits and Semester – IV is 16 Credits).

13.4 The Specialization shall be allotted at the time of commencement of the First Semester.

* Note: The Dissertation work shall commence at the beginning of the Semester - III. However, it shall be concluded and evaluated at the end of Semester - IV.

Explanation

- 1) Theory: Classroom lectures.
- 2) Practical: Internal assessment.
- 3) Compulsory: Includes core and specialization subjects as mentioned above.
- 4) Soft Paper: This is a paper of two credits and can be opted for by the students of any specialization. The students pursuing their Masters Programme from any other Department at the University campus can opt for this paper with the permission of the Head of the Department concerned. In case of students pursuing their Masters Programme from any other affiliated Colleges can opt for this paper with the permission of the concerned Principal of other College.
- 5) Seminar Course: In order to introduce the students to the recent advances in research and the recent developments in the subject concerned, the seminar course is conducted through discussion and presentation by the students. This is done under the personal guidance of the teacher concerned.

1. Evaluation of Students :

1.1 General

- 1) A student cannot appear for semester end examination unless he/she has maintained 75% attendance in the term.
- 2) Each credit will be evaluated for 25 Marks.
- 3) Each credit will be equivalent to 15 clock hours of teaching.
- 4) Credit is a unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week.
- 5) The P. G. Department of affiliated Law College shall announce Seminar Courses to introduce students to recent advances in research. Seminar Course credits are to be conducted through discussion and presentation by the student and personal guidance by the teacher. Seminars shall not exceed a maximum of two credits. The Principal in consultation with P.G. Department Internal Committee of affiliated Law College, will announce Seminar Courses activities.

1.2 Score of Credits

- 1) The Course having 4 credits shall be evaluated for 100 marks and students should secure at least 40 marks (40%) to earn full credit of that course.
- 2) The Course having 2 credits shall be evaluated for 50 marks and students should secure at least 20 marks (40%) to earn full credit of that course.
- 3) The Internal and External examinations will have equal weight of 50% each.
- 4) A Student must obtain marks in Internal and External examinations with minimum passing of 40% in both examinations separately.
- 5) A student cannot register for the third/fourth semester, if she/he fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits expected to be ordinarily completed within the first and second semesters.
- 6) To pass in a course of 4 credits, a student must secure minimum 40 marks, provided that he should secure minimum 20 marks in External University Evaluation (EUE) and 20 marks in Internal Continuous Assessment (ICA).
- 7) To pass in a course of 2 credits, a student must secure minimum 20 marks.
- 8) To pass in dissertation activity, a student must secure minimum 80 marks.
- 9) There shall be a revaluation of the answer scripts of External Examination but not of Internal Assessment as per Ordinance No. 134A & B of the University.
- 10) While marks are given for all internal and external examinations, they will be converted into grades by the University Exam Section. Semester end grade sheets will have only grades and final grade sheets and transcripts shall have grade points average and total percentage of marks.

1.3 Fail to get the required score of Credits

- 1) In case student fails in internal assessment he/she can still be permitted to appear for external examination. However, final result of such student would be "Failed" in that subject.
- 2) If a student gets an F grade in any course, they can reattempt it with both internal assessment (if offered in that semester) and external examination, or only the external examination (if they have scored at least 20 marks in internal assessment), in the next external exam.
- 3) Student who has cleared the Internal Assessment but failed in the semester end exam may reappear for the semester end exam in the subsequent period.
- 4) Student who has cleared the Internal Assessment but failed in the semester end exam and who wants to improve performance in the internal assessment, may be permitted to register again by paying tuition fees for the course when that course is being offered.
- 5) In case a student fails to earn the minimum number of credits required for obtaining a degree within the stipulated period of 4 years, then such a student will be declared as an INCOMPLETE EXIT and in such a case the student can seek a fresh admission as per the admission rules prevailing at that time.



1.4 Award of Grade

Grades will be awarded from Grade Point Average (GPA) of the credits.

1.5 External Examination

1.5.1 External Examination for the 50% marks will be conducted by the Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.

1.5.2 The External examination programme will be scheduled separately for affiliated Law Colleges as per the notifications and guidelines issued by the BoE, SPPU, Pune.

1.6 Internal Examination :

Internal assessment for each course would be continuous and dates for each tutorials/tests etc. will be pre-notified in the timetable for teaching or placed separately as a part of timetable. The affiliated Law College Internal Assessment Committee will coordinate this activity as per their separate schedule.

2. Internal Assessment :

- 1) It is a continuous evaluation process.
- 2) Assessment of internal work will be conducted before conducting External Examination.
- 3) Assessment of internal work will be evaluated by the concerned subject teacher or any other teacher appointed by the Principal of the affiliated Law College.
- 4) The dissertation will be evaluated by one internal and one external examiner.

3. Criterion of Internal assessment for each paper

It shall be based on the following criteria –

3.1 Longish Term Paper – The student has to submit two Longish Term Papers as mentioned below:

- a) For First semester which consists of four theory papers, a student has to submit two Longish Term Papers – one on Research Methodology and one among two specialization subjects.
- b) In the same manner, for Second semester which consists of four theory papers, a student must submit two Longish Term Papers - one on Law and Social Transformation in India and one among two specialized subjects.
- c) A student for the remaining two theory papers in each First and Second Semester has to submit seminar papers which will be followed by seminar paper oral presentation.

3.2 Tutorials, Assignments Group Discussion / An Open Book Test/ Library Research Work/ Extension Work - Maximum 5 on each subject

3.3 Internal written Test – 1 on each subject.

3.4 Viva voce – 1 on each subject

4. Setting of Question Paper

- 1) The question papers for end-semester examinations of Core and Specialization (compulsory) theory courses in affiliated Law Colleges will be set by the Board of Examinations (BoE), Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU), Pune.
- 2) The centralized assessment for theory papers will be done as per the University instructions for the affiliated Law Colleges.

7. Dissertation Activity

Hon'ble T. S. Krishnamurthy

For Excellence in the field of Law & Judiciary

Taruvai Subayya Krishnamurthy was born in the year 1941. He is a former Indian Revenue Service officer who served as 13th Chief Election Commissioner (C.E.C) of India (February 2004 - May 2005).

Krishnamurthy won gold medals in History, Economics and Political Science at Mysore University. He also completed a Masters in Fiscal Studies from the University of Bath, U.K.

Krishnamurthy started his career as a probationary officer at the Bank of India (prior to nationalization) at the age of 19. He joined the Indian Revenue Service in the batch of 1963, subsequent to which he was posted as Income Tax Officer in Madras. Having served number of ministries in New Delhi including Shipping and Finance, he was deputed as a Deputy General Manager with the Hindustan Shipyard Limited in Visakhapatnam. One of the key jobs he has handled was that of Chief Commissioner of Income Tax in Bombay.

As Secretary, Department of Company Affairs, he is credited with setting up of Investor Education and Protection Fund set up from unclaimed dividends of companies.


He has also served as an IMF advisor in Ethiopia and Georgia. As Chief Election Commissioner he was an observer to the elections in Zimbabwe and the U.S Presidential Elections in 2004. In 2005, Krishnamurthy was appointed by the Supreme Court of India to conduct the elections to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (B.C.C.I) in order to ensure free and fair polls amidst the different factions within the BCCI.

His main assignment as C.E.C was to oversee the 2004 elections to the Lok Sabha. He had earlier served in the Election Commission of India as a commissioner since January 2000.

Post his retirement, he is a board member of various companies and NGOs, most notably, he was the Chairman of Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Chennai Kendra. He is the author of the book “Miracles of Democracy”, published in August 2008.

Hon'ble Justice Shri B. N. Srikrishna
(Retd. Justice Supreme Court)

For Excellence in the field of Law & Judiciary

Justice B. N. Srikrishna was born in the year 1941. After graduating with a degree in Science, he went on to obtain his LL.B and later LL.M from the Government Law College and the University of Mumbai, standing second in the entire University.

He enrolled as an advocate of the Bombay High Court in the year 1962 specialising in the field of Labour and Industrial Law and designated as a Senior Advocate of the Bombay High Court in the year 1987. He was counsel for a large number of employers both in the public and private sector and appeared in a number of cases in the High Courts and the Supreme Court, which laid down fundamental principles of labour law.

Justice B.N. Srikrishna's name is synonymous with the commission of enquiry he headed, specifically the report he submitted in February 1998 pertaining to the riots that shook Mumbai in December, 1992-93; that generated widespread debate in India and abroad.

He was appointed by the Supreme Court of India in February/March 2009 to enquire into the incidents of violent clashes between lawyers and police in the premises of the Madras High Court, Chennai. He was also appointed by the Government of India as Chairperson of the Committee for Consultations to consider the demand for bifurcation of the State of Andhra Pradesh.

He was appointed as Chief Justice of the High Court of Kerala in September 2001 and as Honourable Judge of the Supreme Court of India in October 2002, which office he demitted in May 2006. He was also the Chairman of the Sixth Central Pay Commission. He was appointed the Chairperson of the Citizens' Committee for monitoring Security Issues in Mumbai by the High Court of Bombay. He was the Chairperson of the Financial Sector Legislative Reforms Commission appointed by the Government of India.

He was invited by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees to attend a seminar on refugee laws at Delhi and the international conference on the subject in Geneva and Berne in October 2000 and by the Universities of Berkeley U.S.A., Bar Ilan Israel and Oxford U.K. to deliver lectures on Socio-legal subjects. Justice B.N. Srikrishna is currently occupied with arbitral and consultative legal practices since his retirement from the Supreme Court in May 2006.

Hon'ble Justice Shri. V. S. Sirpurkar

For Excellence in the field of Law & Judiciary

Hon'ble Justice Shri. V. S. Sirpurkar is the only Judge in India who has worked in all the three chartered High Courts namely, High Court of Bombay, Madras High Court and Calcutta High Court.

He was born in the year 1946 in a family of lawyers. He topped in the Chandrapur District in Matriculation and thereafter joined Morris College and Law College. He practiced law at the Nasik High Court on Constitutional, Civil and Criminal sides. He was elevated as a Judge of the Bombay High Court in 1992 and later moved to Madras as a Senior Judge and held the post of Executive Chairman of the TamilNadu State Legal Services Authority setting up Lok Adalat Bhavans in 14 districts of Tamil Nadu.

He invented Special Adalats such as Bank Adalats, Tax Adalats and Pension Adalats. He also initiated the opening of the Judicial Academy for Tamil Nadu and started one in West Bengal. He was co-opted as a Member of the Legal Education Committee of the Bar Council of India, New Delhi.

He was elevated as Chief Justice, High Court of Uttarakhand, where he started the Uttarakhand Judicial and Legal Academy besides establishing a number of Law courts and pioneering the idea of combining legal help with medical help that was a boon to the poor in hilly areas. He later assumed office of the Chief Justice of the High Court in Calcutta.

He led a delegation of International Council of Jurists to China wherein the Judges and Bar Leaders from various countries like India, Maldives, Sri Lanka, Turkey and UK participated. He represented High Courts and the Supreme Court of India in the International Conference of Jurists for Judicial Reforms organized by the International Council of Jurists and The Hon'ble Society of Lincoln's Inn, London.

He was nominated as Chairman of the Management Council and Administrative Committee of the India Law Institute. He was instrumental in starting a law college at Indian Institute of Technology at Kharagpur, thus combining Legal training with the Technological aspect.

After coming to the Supreme Court Justice Sirpurkar wrote a number of landmark judgements in the field of Taxation, Central Excise, Customs, Criminal Laws, Land Acquisition and Hindu Laws. Some of his landmark and celebrated judgements have been pertaining to the Red Fort Attack Trial, Kerala Illicit Liquor Scandal, and others related relating to subjects of education, government services, rent control, revenue laws, contempt laws, tax laws and laws relating to religious trusts.

Hon'ble Justice Shri. Parshuram Sawant
(Retd.)

For Excellence in the field of Law & Judiciary

Justice P. B. Sawant was born on June 30, 1930. Mr. Sawant started his career as a lecturer in New Law College, Bombay, in 1965, teaching Private International Law and Constitutional Law. He was appointed to the Bombay high court in 1973, he was elevated to Supreme Court on October 6, 1989. He retired after six eventful years at the apex court on June 29, 1995, but continued to be active in public life for the next 25 years.

Among the landmark judgments which he authored as part of the constitution benches, the decisions in Mandal and S. R. Bommai cases stand out. He was also of the view that the constitution empowers the Centre to satisfy itself completely about the relevant facts in a state from sources other than the Governor.

Justice Sawant once said a judge should develop a strong sense of smell. "If something stinks, then he or she must be extra careful," he said, emphasising how right judicial instinct and skill of the judiciary could stop the misuse of the Public Interest Litigations (PIL) and restore to it to pristine character.

Justice Sawant was an advocate for pro-downtrodden, liberal judicial activism and was a leader of the PIL movement in Maharashtra.

Justice Sawant was the chairman of the inquiry committee set up to investigate the charges against Justice V. Ramaswami, the first judge to face impeachment motion in Parliament, in 1991.

Justice Sawant served as the Chairman of the Press Council of India after his retirement. During his term, he was the architect of the guideline that no newspaper shall publish exit-poll surveys, however genuine they may be, till the last of the polls is over. This was because he believed that the media should not allow themselves to be used for distortions and manipulations of the elections, and should not allow themselves to be exploited by interested parties.

Adv. Ujjwal Nikam is an Indian special public prosecutor who has worked on prominent murder and terrorism cases. He helped prosecute suspects in the 1993 Bombay bombings, the Gulshan Kumar murder case, the Pramod Mahajan murder case, and the 2008 Mumbai attacks. He was also the special public prosecutor in the 2013 Mumbai gang rape case, 2016 Kopardi rape and murder case. Adv. Ujjwal Nikam argued on behalf of the state during the 26/11 Mumbai attack trial.

Nikam was born in Jalgaon, Maharashtra, to Marathi parents. His father, Deoraoji Nikam, was a judge and barrister, and his mother was a homemaker.

After receiving his Bachelor of Science degree, he earned a law degree from the K.C.E. Society's S. S. Maniyar Law College in Jalgaon. His son, Aniket, is also a criminal lawyer in High Court Mumbai.

Nikam began his career as a district prosecutor in Jalgaon and worked his way up to state and national trials. In a 30-year career, he has secured 628 life imprisonments and 37 death penalties. Nikam was awarded the Padma Shri by the Government of India in 2016.

He has been given a security detail with a classification of Z+, the second highest level of security in India.

In December 2010, Nikam represented the Government of India at a worldwide convention on terrorism held at the United Nations in New York.






Rules and Regulations

Suryadatta Group of Institutes (SGI) is committed to excellence in education, character building, and holistic development of students. This rulebook outlines the guidelines and code of conduct expected from every student to ensure a disciplined, safe, and conducive academic environment. All students are required to read, understand, and comply with these rules.

Admission Rules :

1. Application for admission to all programmes must be made on the prescribed application form only. Photocopies of the form are not acceptable.
2. Application form is to be filled by the candidate in his / her own handwriting using ballpoint pen and countersigned by the parents / guardians.
3. It is the collective responsibility of the candidate and the parents to submit required documents by the stipulated date.
4. Students admitted provisionally must fulfil all pending requirements within the stipulated time. All admissions are confirmed subject to the candidate fulfilling all the prescribed eligibility criteria as decided by the competent bodies and payment of requisite fees. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of admission.
5. Fulfilling the eligibility criteria in itself does not assure admission to a programme. The final decision for admission rests with the Institute / College.
6. Mark sheet and School leaving / College leaving certificate of Class X / Class XII and Graduation (as applicable) will have to be submitted in original. Self-Attested Photocopies of certificates other than the above will be accepted.
7. Original documents (mark sheets, school/college leaving certificate) must be submitted for verification. False or forged documents will lead to cancellation of admission without refund.
8. Students and parents are requested to go through the eligibility criteria laid down by the competent authorities for the respective programme. Please note you will be solely responsible if admission stands cancelled due to any non-fulfilment of eligibility criteria at any stage and fees will be refunded as per the rules of the competent authorities.
9. Selected candidates will have to join the Institute / College on the notified date.
10. Management reserves the right of refusal for final admission.

Discipline :

The following rules have to be abided by all students at all times:

1. Students are strictly prohibited from entering the classroom, knocking on the door, or leaving the classroom once the teacher or professor has commenced the lecture. Requests for lecture cancellations directed to the teacher or professor are not permitted. Any behaviour such as peeping into classrooms, making distracting gestures, or similar conduct during lectures will be regarded as acts of misconduct.
2. Students are required to adhere to the prescribed code of conduct and must wear the official institute uniform at all times. Footwear such as slippers, as well as casual attire including jeans and T-shirts, are not permitted on campus.
3. Students are expected to remain informed of the institute's daily activities and comply with all notices and communications posted on the official notice boards.
4. Acts of misconduct such as misbehaviour, tardiness, insubordination, absenteeism, substance abuse, fraudulent practices, and cheating during examinations will result in appropriate disciplinary measures.
5. The Institute Directors hold the authority to impose fines on students for any form of misconduct whenever deemed necessary and justified.
6. The student's career progression, including attendance, academic performance, and disciplinary record, will be communicated to the parents for their information. It is expected that parents acknowledge this information and respond to the Institute by meeting the Director when requested via letter, email, phone, or SMS.
7. Students are required to carry their Identity Card at all times within the Institute premises and during any official visits.
8. It is the responsibility of every student to promptly inform the Institute office of any changes in their name or address. Failure to do so may result in significant delays in managing student records and in emergency notifications at home.
9. The Institute authorities shall not be held responsible or liable for any loss or damage to students' personal belongings.

10. Students are prohibited from engaging in any political or antisocial activities within the Institute. Violation of this policy may result in expulsion.
11. Ragging in any form is strictly forbidden and will be subject to severe disciplinary action in accordance with Government and Institute regulations.
12. Any violation of conduct, whether occurring within or outside the Institute premises, shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
13. The Institute facilitates hostel admissions at accommodations near the campus. Students opting for hostel residence are required to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations outlined in the hostel admission form.
14. The Institute reserves the right to seek compensation equivalent to the original value for any damage caused to equipment, components, or instruments by students.
15. Students are encouraged to fully utilize the available IT facilities to enhance their technical skills. The Institute campus is Wi-Fi enabled, allowing students to access the internet on their laptops throughout the campus, except during academic or lecture hours.
16. Each class shall nominate two students as Class Representatives and an additional two students to serve on the Institute's Discipline Committee. These representatives are expected to report regularly to the Faculty-in-Charge and, when necessary, directly to the Director. Students with concerns or grievances may approach Faculty Members, Professors, or Directors for prompt and fair resolution.
17. Students must strictly comply with all rules and regulations prescribed by local, state, and central government authorities, as well as those established by competent bodies such as BCI, AICTE, DTE, UGC, the University, and the Institute. These regulations shall be enforced as applicable and binding at all times.
18. The Institute reserves the right to amend, modify, or update its norms, policies, rules, and regulations at its discretion and as deemed necessary.
19. In the event of any dispute, the decision of the head of the respective Institute or College shall be final and binding. All legal proceedings shall be subject exclusively to the jurisdiction of Pune.
20. Any involvement in malpractice during examinations or tests, or sexual misconduct, whether within or outside the Institute/College premises, will attract disciplinary action as per applicable Institute and local authority regulations.
21. Students are advised not to bring valuables such as jewellery or other expensive items to campus. If brought, the Institute assumes no responsibility for loss or damage and such items are carried at the student's own risk.
22. In accordance with the rules and regulations of the competent authorities, the use of mobile phones on campus is strictly prohibited. Students are advised not to bring mobile phones to the Institute/College. Any mobile phones brought shall be at the owner's own risk.
23. Students must securely lock and park their vehicles only in designated areas, at their own risk.
24. Use of inappropriate social media sites or violation of Information Technology policies is strictly forbidden. Violation will result in stringent disciplinary measures involving both students and their parents.
25. It is the responsibility of each student to regularly check and stay informed of all notices posted on the official Notice Boards regarding institutional activities and instructions.
26. Students are encouraged to avoid unnecessary wastage of water and electricity and contribute to campus sustainability efforts.

Fees Structure and Rules :

1. All fees must be paid through Demand Drafts, Account Transfers, Card Swipes, or NEFT. Cheques will not be accepted under any circumstances.
2. Fees once paid are refundable solely in accordance with the regulations established by the competent authorities.
3. Students are required to settle all dues, monetary or otherwise, within the prescribed deadlines communicated by the Institute.
4. Upon confirmation of admission & commencement of the course, the student is obligated to pay the full fees applicable for the academic year. The fee must be paid as per the stipulated schedule declared by the institute at the beginning of the Academic Year. Late payment, penalties and instalment charges will be levied for any delays.
5. No capitation fee is charged for admission to any course offered by Suryadatta.
6. Fee refunds shall be processed strictly as per the norms prescribed by the relevant authorities.
7. Full payment of fees must be completed prior to the start of classes. Once admission registration is finalized, requests for course changes, transfers, or cancellations will not be entertained under any circumstances.
8. For re-registration students need to fill out forms and pay the fees.
9. Compliance for Students Belonging to Reserved Categories: Students eligible under government-recognized reserved categories must submit all required documents timely and adhere to the prevailing government rules and regulations regarding fee concessions or scholarships. Failure to

provide adequate documentation, delayed submission, non-compliance with applicable acts, or changes in government policies that affect eligibility will result in the student being liable to pay the full course fee. Non-payment of full fees in such cases will lead to automatic cancellation of admission, and the Institute reserves the right to initiate appropriate disciplinary action.

Attendance :

1. Students are expected to maintain regular and punctual attendance in all scheduled classes.
2. A minimum attendance of 90% is mandatory, allowing for a 10% exemption to accommodate genuine exigencies. Students failing to achieve at least 80% attendance by the end of the semester or term will be deemed ineligible to appear for the final examination.
3. Holiday calendar will be conveyed time to time through official communication channels like notices / emails etc.
4. Excessive unexcused absences may lead to a student's removal from the class. Non-attendance in tests, examinations, tutorials, and failure to submit assignments on time will render the student disqualified from internal assessment evaluations.
5. Participation in all academic and co-curricular activities, including seminars, group discussions, industrial visits, workshops, presentations, guest lectures, yoga sessions, orientation programs, soft skills training, foreign language classes, role plays, and supplementary instructional sessions, is compulsory.
6. Students must report to their respective classrooms at least 5 to 10 minutes prior to the commencement of lectures to ensure a conducive learning environment and to minimize disruptions for faculty and fellow students.

Academics :

1. Prior written permission from the concerned Director of the Institution/College is mandatory for availing leave. Unauthorized absence will result in disciplinary action, and habitual absenteeism without notification may lead to cancellation of admission.
2. Students are required to submit assignments, participate in internal examinations, fieldwork, projects, and other academic activities within the stipulated deadlines and in accordance with the programme and Institute/College guidelines. Relevant schedules will be available on the respective Institute's/College's notice boards.
3. Completion and timely submission of all homework assignments assigned by faculty members is compulsory.

4. Submission of tutorials, assignments, tests, and engagement in other academic activities are essential and mandatory components of the curriculum.
5. The College organizes various co-curricular, cultural, and extracurricular activities throughout the academic year, and student participation in these events is mandatory to facilitate holistic development.

Library Rules :

1. The library card entitles its holder to check out materials as established in the library's circulation policy. The card bearer is responsible for returning materials back to the library on time and in the same condition as when they were checked out. If library materials are returned late or with damage, the management reserves the right to levy fines and/or penalties at its discretion. Library materials should be handled with utmost care. Nobody should write, damage and make any mark on any kind of library materials.
2. Library membership card is non-transferable. Borrowing privileges are available to Members. Materials borrowed from the Library are subject to overdue fines of Rs. 5/- per day per book. Overdue notices will be sent thorough an email or call. These notices are a courtesy. Failure to receive a notice does not constitute a basis for altering or negating a fine.
3. The borrower is fully responsible for the books borrowed in his/her membership card.
4. If necessary, the librarian can cancel the membership and refuse admission to anyone who violates the rules and regulations of the library or indulges in any other type of misconduct.
5. Members who lose books will be expected to submit replacement copy of the same book provided with the current edition or pay double price of the lost book.
6. Library Security - The theft or abuse of Library resources like books, journal issues, reports, and dissertations will be viewed very seriously. Each case will be examined to ascertain its genuineness and the matter will be reported to the COO / CEO for further action.

Hostel :

1. Hostels, paying guest accommodations, and rented lodgings are available in proximity to the campus. Students residing in these accommo-dations must strictly adhere to the rules and regulations prescribed by the respective authorities and comply with local laws.
2. It is strongly recommended that all outstation students avail themselves of the hostel facilities during their first year for better integration and convenience.



Other Rules & Regulations :

1. The Institute organizes Industrial Visits/Court Visits, training sessions, fieldwork, seminars, conferences, yoga and meditation programs on campus, as well as outdoor training camps for comprehensive student development. Students are expected to fully engage in these activities and strictly adhere to all established rules, regulations, disciplinary protocols, and safety guidelines to safeguard their well-being.
2. The Institute/College reserves the right to revise, amend, or update its norms, rules, and regulations at its discretion from time to time.
3. The Director, Principal, and Management retain full authority to take appropriate disciplinary action against students who violate the stipulated guidelines.
4. In the event of any dispute, the final and binding decision shall rest solely with the Director or Principal of the respective Institute/College.
5. Consumption of food and beverages inside classrooms is prohibited. Students must refrain from littering, such as discarding papers or empty bottles on campus or within classrooms, and actively support the "Clean India, Green India" initiative.
6. Upon leaving the classroom, students are responsible for closing windows, switching off fans and lights, arranging chairs neatly, and ensuring the space is left in proper order.
7. Students are not permitted to bring friends or relatives into the campus premises without prior written authorization from the appropriate authorities. Unauthorized entry may result in strict disciplinary measures, including detention or expulsion.
8. Students are required to cooperate fully with security personnel during routine identity card verification and uniform checks.
9. Any request for additional facilities must be formally submitted through a written application to the relevant office.
10. Students should regularly visit the respective Institute/College website to stay updated on notices, schedules, and other important communications.

Anti-Ragging :

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within and outside the Institute premises. Students must abstain from any acts of ragging as defined under the Supreme Court directives and Government regulations, and any violation shall attract severe disciplinary and legal action.
2. Students must immediately report any incident or threat of ragging to the designated Anti-Ragging

Committee or Nodal Officer of the Institute. The Institute provides a confidential and accessible complaint mechanism, including helpline support, to ensure prompt redressal.

3. Participation in ragging or abetting such acts, whether directly or indirectly, will lead to strict punitive measures, including suspension, expulsion, rustication, and possible criminal prosecution as per the laws of the land.
4. The Institute mandates induction programs, awareness sessions, and continuous monitoring through Anti-Ragging Committees and squads to prevent ragging and promote a safe, inclusive environment for all students.
5. All students shall submit a signed anti-ragging undertaking during admission, acknowledging their understanding of these rules and their commitment to maintaining a ragging-free campus.

Grievances Redressal Committee :

1. Anyone having grievances can approach to Grievances Redressal Committee where students can submit complaints or grievances and have addressed fairly.
2. It consists of Principal, Secretary, faculty members, student representatives etc.
3. All grievances hearing will take place in front of Committee and decision of the Principal will be final.

I DECLARE AND UNDERTAKE THAT :

1. I have thoroughly read, comprehended, and accepted all codes of discipline, academic standards, rules and regulations, and mandatory information as detailed in the admission prospectus, Institute website, and accompanying undertakings. I shall duly acknowledge and adhere to all communications issued by the Institute from time to time.
2. I am fully aware that ragging is strictly prohibited across all educational institutions in accordance with the Supreme Court directives and Government regulations. I undertake not to engage in any form of ragging or related activities, failing which I shall be subject to disciplinary measures as prescribed.
3. I commit to collecting all original and relevant documents from the Institute within a period of three months following the completion of my programme.
4. I acknowledge that the Institute shall not be held liable for any loss or misplacement of my documents if they remain uncollected beyond the stipulated timeframe post-programme completion.


